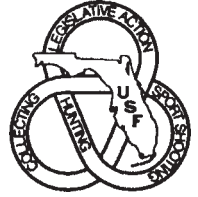

Garand Matches 08 May and 29 May

GRPC held its spring Garand Match on 08 May, and hosted the Marine Corps League Garand Match (open to everyone) on 29 May.

The first match drew 41 competitors, split into two relays. Garands were the most commonly seen rifle, with a sprinkling of Springfields and M1 Carbines. The shooters were broken into two classes again, "Shirts" and "Skins". Shirts were those shooters using specialized shooting coats. Skins were those using street apparel or light cotton coats.

The match consists of three stages, all fired on the SR-1 target. The SR-1 has the "9" and "10" rings in black, 12.75 in diameter circle, and scoring rings 3 inches in width out to the "5" value. Any shots outside the Five ring are recorded as "M" for miss, and with zero value.

The first stage is ten rounds slowfire, single loaded, in a time limit of ten minutes. Some impressive scores were turned in on this.

The second stage is "prone

rapidfire", designating a start from the standing position to prone, and ten rounds fired in 70 seconds. Ahem. That's by the book. Since we are not at the National Matches, and the goal is safe fun, the timekeeping was not strict, nor was a cease-fire called until the last rounds were off. Trust me, it took more than 70 seconds. In fact, had score-value-shots-only been counted at the end of 70 seconds, about a third of the contestants would have had ten rounds away, and there would have been a lot of scores in the 40 to 60 point range, out of a possible 100. Again, some very good scores were seen here.

The third stage is ten rounds, standing, no sling use by anyone, slowfire, single load. Also known as the "Awful-hand" position. Let us gloss over this by saying the range of scores was impressive.

Everyone seemed to have a good time, or at least didn't grumble about it much. A couple "poof" loads resulted in dropped points, and the Garand remains a rifle which demands respect on both ends.
