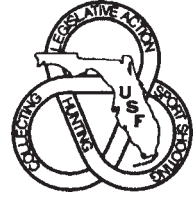

PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE CLUB BY-LAWS

As our Club has grown, so has the complexity with which we operate. There are no honorary positions for Club officers or board members. Each position is a working position which requires detailed knowledge of the Club's operation and financial transactions.

PRESENT

Present by-laws only state in paragraph 5.(d): No member will be eligible for nomination nor election as an officer in the first year of membership. No member shall be eligible for nomination nor election as President more than two terms out of any six year consecutive six year period. The six year period shall begin on January 1st and shall include the eight year period prior to the adoption of this statement.

There are no present by-law requirements for election to the Board of Directors.

PROPOSED

1. For nomination or election to the office of President, at least five years continuous membership in the Club and at least three years consecutive service on the Board of Directors shall be required. The President may only be elected and serve for only two consecutive years. After a two year interval, the previously elected President may again be nominated and elected for the office of President for up to another two years and so on.

2. For nomination and election to Club officer positions other than President, at least three years continuous membership in the Club and one year's service on the Board of Directors shall be required.

3. For nomination and election to the Board of Directors, at least two years continuous membership in the Club and attendance of at least five of the previous twelve Board meeting prior to the election date.

PRESENT

The Public Relations office was created for Joe Newman who had a table at local gunshows. The bylaws state in paragraph 6.(g) that "The public relations officer will be in charge of the Club's public relations and shall also act at the Club's membership Director at gun shows."

The Club was represented at only five gun shows in the last three years. Bill Craig was at the five shows for a total of ten days. He stated the interest generated was not worth the effort. The last gun show had record attendance but only four people asked questions and two of them were already Club members.

PROPOSED

4. Abolish the office of public relations director. Eliminate any reference to "being the membership director at gun shows." The bylaws in paragraph 6.(b) state, "The Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President in his/her absence or at their request." Add the sentence "The Vice- President shall also be in charge of the Club's public relations."

I have submitted the above by-law changes as outlined in the Club's by-laws. The Club's By-laws state that any member can propose by-law changes and that the general membership must be notified 15 day prior to a meeting of said membership. The proposed changes are the results of a meeting by the By-law Committee consisting of Sam Grimes, Bill Craig, John Graves, and Thomas Beattie. These changes have not been approved or endorsed by the Board.

All those doodads. Front and rear rests, rifle cradles, blistering optics, two-ounce triggers, specialty calibers, all in search of riflecraft. Do you have any interest in putting the shooter back into the sport of shooting? That is, relatively simple rifles, metallic sights, a good sling and some challenging shooting? If so, have you ever thought of entertaining High Power Rifle Target Shooting? This sport reduces the "engineering race" to about 15% of the game, and relies on the ol' Mk I Human and the Mod. 2 Brain for the other 85% of the success factor.

HiPower target shooting is based on military-issued rifles, including MI Garands, 1903 Springfields, MIA clones of the M14, and the AR series clones of the M16. There are also classes for Match Rifles (metallic target sights), Any-Any rifles (any rifle, any sight).

BOTH MATCHES ARE SHOT AT 200 YARDS ON THE SR-2 TARGET, WITH "9" AND "10" RINGS IN A 12.75 INCH BULL, SCORING RINGS OUT TO "5" VALUE. 5 SHOT SIGHTER PERIOD, 10 SHOTS PRONE SLOWFIRE, 10 SHOTS SUSTAINED FIRE FROM PRONE, 10 SHOTS OFFHAND SLOWFIRE. NEW CLASSES: WE USED TO SHOOT "SHIRTS AND SKINS" (SHOOTING COATS/STREET WEAR). WE WILL FURTHER SUBDIVIDE AS FOLLOWS: "T" = COMPETING FOR TROPHY, AND "NT" = SHOOTING FOR FUN. THE "T" DIVISION WILL HAVE THE TIME LINE ON THE RAPID STAGE ENFORCED, MEANING ANY SHOTS OUTSIDE OF THE 70 SECOND ALLOCATED TIME WILL NOT BE COUNTED FOR SCORE. "NT" SHOOTERS WILL HAVE SUFFICIENT TIME FOR ALL COMPETITORS TO TAKE 10 SHOTS.

The course of fire is usually 50 rounds for record, with sighters either at the beginning of the match, or two sighters per stage. We shoot at KD (Known Distance), and usually have a sighter period at the beginning of the match for those who have changed sights, loads, barrels, rifles, minds, or just want confirmation of previous settings.

The match consists of four stages:

1. Ten rounds fired offhand (standing, no sling use), slowfire, single loading, in 10 minutes.

2. Ten rounds sustained fire from sitting, mandatory reload involved, in 60 seconds. Sling OK

3. Ten rounds sustained fire from prone, mandatory reload, in 70 seconds. Sling OK.

4. Twenty rounds slowfire from prone, single loading, sling OK, twenty minutes. The targets are reduced in size and scoring ring configuration to represent 300 yard distance for stage 3, and again reduced to represent 600 yard distance for stage 4, since we are limited to 200 yards.

V. Committee Reports

A. Policy Committee—Updated policies are available for the Board members that keep their own policy books.

C. Glock Match: Preston asked if Glock was paying with the gun certificates as they did last year. He stated W. Herrick was the only one with access to the certificates and only the SESPA people got to buy them. Grimes suggested a lottery or drawing. Auction and other ways were discussed.

VI Old Business

Range Safety Issues. D. Rifkin had previously made recommendations to the board in two areas. Stop bullets from leaving the range and eyebrows and raising sidewalls. It is obvious that at the present time not enough money for the recommended range improvements. He has discovered that there is not a long range budget for range improvements.

One needs to be created. Kerbs stated that the improvements would make the property more valuable. G. Preston suggested that the club borrow money to do the improvements in lieu of paying as you go out of pocket. After many suggestions were made about what improvements are needed and how to build the, Grimes appointed a committee. Hux, Preston and Beattie will be on the Range Safety Construction Committee. Budget Committee to meet. Committee will be Craig, Rifkin, Beattie.

Rifkin had seven other recommendations to minimize risk.

1. More instruction for the range safety officers. Make sure they understand their duties and the Club polices.

2. Office personal need to be sure that people what the training video and be

check closer to be sure all daily shooters watch the video.

3. Posted Range rules need to be updated.

4. Red-line safety rule is working and is being accepted.

5. Having more range safety officers on weekends and holiday. Officer to be on pistol ranges full time and one other officer to be on 100-yard line with routine visits to the other ranges other than the pistol ranges.

6. Stop using the training video and return to the old system of contact training. Only daily members are given a written test. At present there is not a test for new members. Preston suggested that a more extensive test be given. Hux stated that the video let the Club have control of what is presented to the members. There was discussion about the effectiveness of any training video. A motion was made and seconded to return to the in person training. Rifkin requested a Roll Call Vote. Motion Failed: Rifkin, Vaughn and Bump in favor. All others opposed. Wakins abstained.

John Graves made the motion to update the video and make a more comprehensive open book test. There was a second.

Wakins recommended that the test should be give to everyone. The motion was amended to immediately improve the test on the safety part of the video for all new member and daily shooters. Motion Passed

Motion made and seconded to have a passing score of 100%. Motion Passed

A committee was formed to update the training video. Jodie Gravis, B. Craig and L. Watkins are the members.

3. Photo Id Very expensive and needs more research.

4 Air Rifle Silhouette Mel White wants to resume the matches that were stopped by the board. He had made several suggestions for safety improvement.. Gwaltney said he would review the improvements. Motion Passed

5. Sunshine Classic. Asked for \$500 for seed money and to be allowed to drink beer after range is closed. Motion Passed

Another Blatant Plug for High Power Rifle Shooting Games:

Have you the ultimate rifle, the hotshot load, best bullet, and ready to try yourself out? GRPC hosts a 3x20 prone match every third Saturday morning of the month, all year. Nominal starting time for registration (5\$, can you beat that) about 0730, may vary with temperature.

The 3x20 stands for Three stages, and Twenty rounds for record shot on each stage, for a possible maximum score of 600. This match is strictly a prone (belly shooting) event, and is open to any safe rifle/caliber combination. There are "classes" to this game, being:

1. Service Rifle: any US issued military rifle and its clones (Springfields, Garands, M1As, AR series) as long as they have the external appearance and sight systems as issued. Internal fiddling (triggers, bedding, float tubes, better-adjustable sights) OK, ammunition to the imagination of the shooter. Service Rifles are shot with use of military-issue/clone slings. Shooting coats, gloves/mitts OK. 4.5 lb trigger minimum, one day we may actually check this.

2. Match Rifle: any action rifle, any caliber, with metallic sight systems. This can include aperture sights fore and aft, hand stops, "match" type slings, no minimum trigger weight, etc. Coats, gloves/mitts OK

3. Any/Any: any action rifle, any caliber, any sight system, any sling configuration, hand stop, etc. OK. Shooting coats/gloves/mitts OK.

4. The increasingly popular "F" (free rifle) class: any action/caliber safe rifle, BUT, the shooter gets to use front and rear rests. I suppose you could shoot this in full plate armor if you wanted. It has been called "prone benchrest", and some very handsome scores and "X" counts have been generated.

The event starts with a 15 minute period for an unlimited number of sighter shots, again for those who have changed rifle, load, whatever. The 20 rounds for record are shot in a 20 minute time period. All shooting at 200 yards, using the MR-52 target which is scaled to represent the 600 yard Mid Range target. This target provides a generous 3.8" ten ring, and a 1.8" X-ring. Thus, if you can repeatedly drop all your shots into the ten ring, you will do well. Of course, this is an outdoor sport, and light, wind, mirage, etc. need to be factored into your shooting.

This match takes less than two hours, and puts a premium on the shooter. Give it a try?
