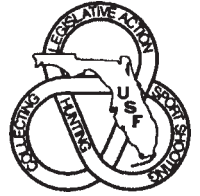

## PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE GRPC BY-LAWS

Old

3 (b) Lifetime memberships shall be the sum of ten times the annual dues plus sales tax.

New

3 (b) Lifetime memberships shall be the sum of ten times the annual dues plus sales tax. Life membership is limited to ten percent of the previous year's annual membership. A sign up list will be kept in the Club Office.

3 (c) A third class of membership to be known as Endowment. The dues will be twenty times the annual dues plus sales tax. A present life member may become an Endowment member by paying ten times the annual dues plus sales tax.

Old

5(a) The officers of this club shall be the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Chief Instructor, and Public Relations, who with the additional elected board members acting together shall constitute the Board of Directors.

New

5(a) The officers of this club shall be the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and Public Relations, who with the additional elected board members shall constitute the Board of Directors.

Old

(c) Secretary. The Secretary shall conduct official correspondence pertaining to the proper preparation and forwarding of all reports. He shall notify the members of the Board of Directors of all meetings as required by these by laws. He shall keep a true record of all meetings of the Board of Directors and of the meetings of the membership of the corporation and shall be the official custodian of the books and papers of the corporation, except the Treasurer's books of the account. All applications for membership in the corporation shall be made to the Secretary, or to the membership chairman that he may appoint. He shall be responsible for the collection of all fees and dues and shall remit the same to the treasurer, taking his proper receipt therefore. The Secretary shall be responsible for submitting all papers and documents necessary to affiliate this corporation with the National Rifle Association and the secretary shall be responsible for reaffiliating this corporation annually with the National Rifle Association.

New

(c) Secretary. The Secretary shall conduct official correspondence pertaining to the proper preparation and forwarding of all reports. He shall notify the members of the Board of Directors of all meetings as required by these by laws. He shall keep a true record of all meetings of the Board of Directors and of the meetings of the membership of the corporation and shall be the official custodian of the books and papers of the corporation, except the Treasurer's books of the account. An up to date copy of the BOD and General Membership minutes will be kept in the Club Office for review by all members. He shall also keep a master copy of all old, new and revised policies. The Secretary shall be responsible for reaffiliating this corporation annually with the National Rifle Association.

Old

(d) Treasurer. The Treasurer shall have charge of all funds of the club and shall place the same in such bank or banks as may be approved by the Board of Directors. Such money shall only be withdrawn upon authority of the Board of Directors by a check signed by the Treasurer, President, Vice President, Secretary, or one Board Member appointed by the Board. (6) Any two of the aforementioned signatures shall be necessary on any check or savings withdrawal. The board of directors may establish a secondary checking account for payment of day to day Club bills or purchases previously authorized by the board. Such a secondary checking account could have a single signature for payment but deposits into the secondary account from the primary account must have two signatures of the three authorized. Monetary limits, other restrictions and ongoing operation as directed by the board of directors. All signatures to club financial accounts must be bonded with a sum commensurate with the balance of the preceding annual financial report. The Treasurer shall keep an accurate account of all club financial transactions and render a detailed report with supporting vouchers at any meeting of the Board of Directors when requested and a detailed annual report to the corporation at its annual meeting. An annual financial audit will be conducted at the end of each calendar year by a panel of at least three (3) members selected by the newly elected President at the annual meeting. Their findings will be published and made available to the general membership.

New

(d) Treasurer. The Treasurer shall have charge of all funds of the club and shall place the same in such bank or banks as may be approved by the Board of Directors. Such money shall only be withdrawn upon authority of the Board of Directors by a check signed by the Treasurer, President, Vice President, Secretary, or one Board Member appointed by the Board. Any two of the aforementioned signatures shall be necessary on any check or savings withdrawal. The Payment of day to day Club bills such as utilities, or purchases previously authorized by the board may be done by electronic or on-line means by the Club Business Manager under the direction of the Club Treasurer. Monetary limits, other restrictions and ongoing operation will be directed by the board of directors. The Treasurer shall keep an accurate account of all club financial transactions and render a detailed report with supporting vouchers at any meeting of the Board of Directors when requested and a detailed annual report to the corporation at its annual meeting. An annual financial audit will be conducted each calendar year of the previous year's finances by a panel of at least

After a careful review of the Club's by-laws, I feel that changes are necessary to bring certain articles up to date. With the unanimous consent of the BOD, I will propose the following changes at the Nov. 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting to be voted on by the membership present.

Most of the changes come from the recent consolidation and revision of the existing Club policies. To avoid redundancy, I have placed wording from some policies into the by-law changes.

One important change is the elimination of the office of Chief Instructor. In the past the Chief Instructor ran the safety orientation classes. This is now being done by having new members watch a video and take a test. Most of the activity and match scheduling is now being done by the Club Business Manager.

The duties of the Treasurer, Secretary, and Public Relation Officer have also changed with the addition of new duties to reflect the needs of the Club today. The Life membership was limited to 10% of the total membership by policy in 2004. The wording of this policy should be in the by-laws.

The wording for Endowment Membership has been changed for clarification. The final change is to clarify the procedure for BOD vacancies. Please attend the meeting and vote.

three (3) members selected by the newly elected President. This audit will take place after the final financial statements are completed. Their findings will be published and made available to the general membership.

Old

(g) Public Relations Officer: The public relations officer shall be in charge of the club's public relations and also act as the club's membership director at gun shows. (5)

New

(g) Public Relations Officer; the public relation officer shall be in charge of the club's public relation, club swap meets, membership meeting or any activity which promotes the club. He shall coordinate with any non-club organization which wants to use the club's facilities.

Old

(g) A vacancy in the Board of Directors may be filled by a majority vote of the remaining directors until the date of the next annual meeting as herein above provided Board meeting. However, if more than one vacancy exists, a special meeting of the membership of the corporation shall be called and new officers shall be elected to fill the vacancies until the date of the next annual meeting as hereinabove provided.

Absentee ballots may be completed at the Club office. Members will write or mark their choices on the ballot, to include write in candidates. The ballot will be folded to insure privacy and placed in a plain white envelope supplied by Club office personnel. The Club office person receiving the sealed ballot will verify the Club member active status. The words "Absentee Ballot" will be written on the front of the envelope. ## Just So You Know...

*What is a "Transition" when handling a shotgun and how to practice it*

The type of transition we are going to discuss today relates to transitioning from one type of ammunition to another without disabling the gun (shotgun). This is a VERY useful function—and fun—and that serves more than one purpose.

Why would you need a transition? Simply because home-defense shotguns are generally initially loaded with the Soft-recoil tactical load. Light enough shoot easy and strong enough to hit targets hard. The problem is the short range effectiveness of such loads. Beyond 30 yards it gets pretty weak by the yard, thus the need to be able to make a quick transition to a more effective—and accurate—round while maintaining shooting readiness.

Well thought-out home-defense shotguns are equipped with a device that hold ready four or five slugs up-side-down (generally *rifled slugs* since short barrels generally have smooth bore), on the closed side of the receiver, or the out-side of the stock,.

The proper way to make a transition is as follow:

1. Maintain your shotgun in shooting position with your STRONG HAND.
2. Free your WEAK HAND (you immediately come to appreciate the value of a shotgun stock equipped with a pistol grip).
3. Use your WEAK HAND to pull a slug by reaching UNDER the out-side of your stock (that why you want them up-side-down) in order to not obstruct your view of the target, or pulling it down from the side of the receiver.
4. Load the slug into the magazine.
5. Put your weak hand back under the fore-end.
6. Press the Action Bar Lock with your trigger finger & cycle the pump: this will eject the live round from the chamber and load the slug in place.

Yes, you dump a live round on the ground, but you have transitioned to respond effectively to a long range target well under a second without disabling the gun—which is the priority of this exercise. This technique can also be used to reload or handle a misfire (after waiting for the appropriate delay) or other stoppages.

The one mistake you do not want to do is to use your strong hand to load the round. This would put you in a position where you would be holding the shotgun by the fore-end with your weak hand and have the ammo in the other. That means that if another target popped up at close range your only engagement option would to throw the round—or the gun—at it. Think about it.

I take the opportunity to thank MUZZLEBLAST for having published my previous article along with the website to the 3-GUN club/range I own to accommodate those of you who will miss 3-GUN shooting on the fifth Saturdays. We had a good response from members.
