2023 Recap

Last year was satisfactory for the club, but we were reminded about how important safe gun handling was and the importance of safety in general. All members who see an unsafe condition, should say something or call a range officer.

We budgeted a small monetary loss for projects and in light of rising costs but after the summer doldrums were over, we had a nice increase in day member fees and new memberships so we ended the year in a good place. Our membership is stable. The big increase in membership that we experienced during Covid has now stabilized and we are in the 3500-member range. Costs for everything are up for the club just like it is for all of us and we need to continue to manage the club wisely.

In other news, we are converting the wedge-shaped back range to be for plinking. Like the other ranges .22 and pistol rounds can be used as well as rifles which are chambered for common pistol cartridges. There will be some reactive targets installed and facilities for setting up tin cans. Plastic bottles like soft drinks use are acceptable too. NO GLASS. Bring your 10-22 and have fun safely!

In the coming year we have some basic maintenance to catch up on. The roof on the admin building has had some leaks and needs attention. Several other places on the range are showing signs of age. One of the wood storage buildings on Range 5 will be replaced, and the roads need major attention. In addition, we plan to buy another cart as the old ones are wearing out.

A class for beginning shooters is under development and we will have something to offer those just getting started. Safety is emphasized and there will be range time as part of the class. See below for more information.

A lot of the improvements we made some years ago continue to need attention and we want to overhaul or replace as necessary. Fortunately, we have some savings to rely on as some of these things are expensive. As the year progresses we hope the changes we make add to your enjoyment when at the range.

The main goal the Board has when planning these things is to have a club that will endure. We want the youngest current member to be able to bring their grandchildren here in years to come and to learn to shoot!

Attention all Pistol Shooters!

Join the fun at GRPC on the 1st and 3rd Sundays at 9:00 AM By Ted Carter

Has it been a while since you shot your pistol or revolver, or did you get something "good" for Christmas? Do you remember the fun of shooting your pistol and enjoying a little range time with your fellow shooters? Then this is your 2024 invitation to spend a couple of hours on the range and have some fun with your pistol along with other shooters.

Gateway holds two pistol events every month.

1st Sunday of the Month

On the first Sunday of the month, we meet at the 25/50yard pistol range and start shooting at 9:00 AM. We'll end by noon, just in time for lunch. We shoot the Florida Police Officer's Association (FPOA) course, which is 90 rounds, fired on paper targets at 25 yards for slow fire and 15 or 25 yards (weather permitting) for timed and rapid fire. We begin with the .22 caliber pistol/revolver and then shoot the course again with a Center Fire pistol/revolver (.32 - .45 caliber). But not to worry, if all you brought was your .22, you are welcome to shoot the course again. We also call this the fun match, as our goal is to have fun and provide a venue that allows you the chance to shoot your match conditioned pistol or "out of the box" pistol with other beginner, or not so beginner shooters in a relaxed environment. You may shoot with one hand or with both hands, however you are most comfortable. If you're not ready to shoot the NRA Precision Pistol match, or just want to come out and shoot your pistol with other shooters, then this is your event. The cost to shoot is \$10.00, and Gateway provides targets and backers.

3rd Sunday of the Month

On the third Sunday of the month, starting at 9:00 AM, we meet at the 25/50-yard pistol range to shoot an NRA or CMP 1800 or 2700 Precision "Bullseye" Pistol match. This match is traditionally shot one handed at 50 yards for slow fire and at 25 yards for timed and rapid fire. While it's more challenging than the FPOA shoot, the different NRA/CMP Classifications that are based on your ability, offer anyone the opportunity to join in the fun. The cost to shoot is \$15.00 to cover the NRA/CMP fees, and Gateway provides the targets and cardboard backer. We'll finish around noon and then head to lunch.

With the NRA rule changes, shooters can register in one of two divisions, Metallic or Open. To invite more shooters to try the sport of Precision Pistol, formally called Conventional Pistol, but more commonly known throughout the community as Bullseye Pistol, the NRA introduced the two divisions several years ago. The Open Division includes any semi-automatic handgun or revolver using any sights, including telescopic, except for those sights that project an image on the target. Like the Open Division, the Metallic Division includes .22 caliber, up to and including .45 caliber pistols and revolvers. As its name implies, the authorized sights are metallic, no optic sights are permitted. The pistol may also be match conditioned. There are a few other restrictions, and as with all pistols or revolvers, all "operational" safety features of the guns must operate properly. For 2024 Gateway is offering two CMP Match Pistol events. The CMP Match Pistol rules are very similar to the NRA rules and competitors will have the opportunity to establish or build on their CMP classification.

If all you have is a .22 caliber pistol, both the NRA and CMP allow you to compete in the 22 Caliber Only Aggregate Match. 2023 Ladies Day at Gateway

On Saturday, November 18th, nearly 100 women participated in Ladies Day at Gateway, hosted by Gateway Rifle & Pistol Club. The annual event provides the ladies with an orientation to safe gun handling, and gives them training with pistols, air rifles, the AR-15 rifle, and cowboy action shooting.

It was a full day of fun for the ladies. We started with a welcome from



Gateway's President Bill King. Sue Carter, Ladies Day Coordinator and NRA Certified Instructor, gave the safety orientation, discussing the four rules of safe gun handling and what they mean.

After the safety brief, the women were split into five groups. They rotated through the different activities to sample several different styles of shooting.





On the air gun range the women were instructed how to shoot air rifles at a distance of 10-meters. The range was indoors, so everyone stayed warm and comfortable. Marion Estes and the coaches gave a brief lesson on how the air rifle worked, and basic sight alignment and trigger squeeze. Although the targets were small, they did very well.





This year we welcomed Chris Oklevitch and Ashley Hecht from the Women's Defense Company. Chris and Ashley offered a mini self-defense class, teaching reality-based skills and techniques that empower students to reduce risks or stop an attack. The

women had fun learning about weapons and targets that we all have and can use to defend ourselves without becoming professional ninjas.

At the pistol range, the ladies shot .22 caliber pistols at 7 yards, shooting with using two hands. They were separated into two relays, allowing the coaches to have only one student at a time. After an orientation on the firearm, safe gun handling, and loading and unloading, the women had the opportunity to show their skills. The coaches reviewed the fundamentals of a good shot, position, grip, sight alignment, sight picture, breathing, trigger press and follow through. Shooting iron sights, the goal was to learn to group their shots anywhere on the target. The coaches were impressed!









Cowboy action shooting is always a big hit for the ladies and this year didn't disappoint. Dakota Lil and her gang did a great job of



introducing the women to the period dress and the firearms of the era. They had the chance to shoot revolvers and shotguns at steel targets placed at different distances. The patience and thoughtfulness of the Cowford Regulators working with the ladies helped many overcome their personal fears of firearms and shoot pretty darn well with them!





On the rifle range, the ladies learned what an AR-15 was, how it worked, the different calibers available and why it was

so much fun to shoot. Mike Hicks coordinated the coaches and reviewed the safety rules and the fundamentals of a good shot. The ladies were seated and used either a tripod on the rifle or a sandbag for stability. The reactive targets were set at 25 yards away.



The ladies then had a chance to shoot steel plates at

100-yards away. This was a huge hit! Overall, this was a great introduction for many of the ladies, who came away with a new understanding and appreciation of the rifle.



Boxed lunches were catered by Gator BBQ, with chicken, pulled pork, coleslaw, baked beans, and of course their fabulous banana pudding. A vegetarian salad was also available. No one left hungry!

Gateway Rifle and Pistol Club to host the 32nd Annual Dixie Match

The Dixie Match has long been a favorite "Bullseye" Pistol competition for many shooters. It continues to be the premier NRA individual and team Regional event in the southeast. This year the Dixie Match will be held at Gateway's 25- and 50-yard range facility on April 19, 20 and 21. Additionally, Air Pistol events will be held in the Bill Craig facility on all days.

The Dixie Match combines an NRA Regional Precision Pistol Championship with a .22 Caliber Only Aggregate Match, NRA Distinguished Revolver Match, CMP Service Pistol EIC Match and CMP .22 RIMFIRE EIC Pistol Match. That's a lot of shooting over three days. In addition to attracting shooters from Florida, Georgia South Carolina and Alabama, the Dixie Match has attracted shooters from Virginia, Maryland, Pennsylvania, and several other states. The Army Marksmanship Unit, National Guard and the Marine Corps Reserve Pistol teams have participated in this match.



Jacksonville's great weather is one reason shooters like competing at the Dixie's, but most importantly, shooters like the impressive range facilities and the professionally run match. Gateway's Board of Directors has been very supportive of the match. The range maintenance crew does a fantastic job getting the range in top readiness condition to host the match. 2023 Florida State Precision Pistol Championship

with Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Service Pistol & .22 Rimfire E.I.C. Match and National Rifle Association (NRA) Distinguished Revolver Match

The Florida State Precision Pistol Championships were fired at Gateway Rifle and Pistol Club (GRPC) on October 21 & 22. Both Saturday and Sunday were beautiful days as thirty-one (31) shooters from six (6) states competed in a great two-day event. Seth Innes (Hollywood, FL) was the match winner, High Civilian, High Senior, and High Veteran category winner, firing a 2558-79X and was awarded the Florida Sport Shooting Association trophy as State Precision Pistol Champion. GRPC member, Randy Erickson finished second with a 2544-64X, with third overall going to Robet Fanucci (Mershon, GA) firing a 2542-81X. Nestor Pena (Winter Haven, FL) was the High Master Class and High Service winner followed by Ed Grove (Pasadena, MD) who won the Master Class. GRPC member Kelvin Alleyne won the Expert Class and Russ Gill (Apopka, FL) took the combined Sharpshooter/Marksman Class. Tim Goszka (Sun City Center, FL) was the Florida Grand Senior Champion. Derek Simmons (Lake Mary, FL) was the Metallic Division winner, and Clark Rhiel (Cape Coral, FL) was the Florida Police category winner. Melinda Lowery (Lampasas, TX) was the High Women category winner, and Doug Roe (The Villages, FL) was the .22 Only Aggregate winner.

The CMP .22 Rimfire EIC match had 19 competitors. Mark Goodman (St. Petersburg, FL) won the match with a 282-2X, Seth Innis finished second with a 280-5X and Nestor Pena was third, firing a 276-7X. In the Distinguished Revolver Match, with 13 competitors, Randy Erickson was the winner with a 258-4X, edging out Bob Hathcox (MacClenny, FL), who posted 257-6X. Finishing third was Nestor Pena with a 256-4X. The CMP Service Pistol EIC, with 14 competitors, was won by Randy Erickson with a 276-8X. Seth Innes was second with a 274-5X and Robert Fanucci was third, firing a 269-9X.

This year, the Florida State Pistol Championships was held in conjunction with NRA Day.

NRA Day provided all competitors the opportunity to come together at the state championships to learn, experience, share, and grow in appreciation of the shooting sports. The Florida Sport Shooting Association or FSSA, is your state shooting association. Formed in 1986 as a Not-for-Profit Corporation, the Florida Sport Shooting Association (FSSA) is Florida's National Rifle Association (NRA) state association. In addition to affiliation with the NRA, FSSA is also affiliated with the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) and USA Shooting (USAS). We also coordinate with the Florida Sports Foundation to schedule select shooting venues for the Sunshine State Games. The FSSA is a tax-exempt 501c (3) organization and does no pollical lobbying.

The FSSA strives to create a public sentiment of support for the individual possession of firearms by law-abiding citizens. We strongly encourage education and training in the use of firearms. An essential purpose of the FSSA is to encourage the proper organization, operation, and administration of member clubs, to promote and coordinate statewide activities related to the ownership and lawful use of firearms, and to cooperate with other organizations in the conservation of wildlife resources within the State of Florida. Additionally, the FSSA fully supports and/or encourages:

- The constitutional rights of the individual American citizen to acquire, transport, possess, carry, and transfer ownership of arms.
- The promotion of recreational and sports shooting.
- The promotion and approval of State Championship tournaments and the promotion of other shooting championships and other competitions.
- The acceptance of marksmanship as a major competitive sport in the State's publicly and privately endowed school systems, both secondary and collegiate.
- The promotion and defense of hunter safety training, hunting as a shooting sport, and conservation, as viable and necessary methods of fostering the propagation, growth, conservation and wise use of renewable wildlife and natural resources.

Where To Shoot What At Gateway

DAY MEMBERS and ANNUAL / LIFE MEMBERS: RANGES 1 & 2

RANGE 1, PISTOLS and REVOLVERS: Located to far left as you exit the club store.

No rifles or shotguns allowed NO FIRING OF HIGH POWER RIFLE ROUNDS (i.e. 223, 556, 7.62x39, 308, etc.) ALLOWED ON RANGE 1

RANGE 2, as follows: Located slightly left as you exit the club store.

BENCH SHOOTING ONLY

RIFLES, CARBINES, AR and AK style pistols with arm brace: All positions except 27 & 28: All calibers including rimfires, pistol calibers, high power/centerfire calibers, and black powder. AR and AK pistols must be fired supported from bench.

SHOTGUNS with shoulder stocks:

Positions 1-26: For shotguns with iron sights or optics, i.e. not a "bead" only front sight and must shoot slugs or turkey loads Position 27: This position is for "patterning" birdshot loads. Ammunition must be #6 through #9 shot.

Position 28: This position is for function checking. Ammunition must be #6 through #9 shot.

SHOTGUNS without shoulder stocks:

Position 28 only: This position is for function checking. Ammunition must be #6 through #9 shot.

ANNUAL AND LIFE MEMBERS ONLY: RANGES 3-8

PISTOLS AND REVOLVERS:

RANGES 5 and 7 including the 25/50-yard Bullseye range: Pistol caliber ammunition only.

NO FIRING OF HIGH POWER RIFLE ROUNDS (i.e. 223, 556, 7.62x39, 308, etc.) ALLOWED ON RANGES 5 and 7.

RANGE 4B: Barrels must be 2 inch minimum length. Pistol caliber ammunition only. NO FIRING OF HIGH POWER RIFLE ROUNDS (i.e. 223, 556, 7.62x39, 308, etc.) ALLOWED ON RANGE 4B. RANGE 4A: Barrels must be 10 inch minimum length.

HIGH POWER RIFLE CALIBER ROUNDS ARE NOT ALLOWED.

RANGE 3: Must be capable of accurate fire at 200-yards. High power rifle caliber rounds ARE allowed.

AR15 AND AK47 STYLE PISTOLS WITH ARM BRACE:

RANGES 2, 4A, and 8: Must be supported/aimed fire from bench. High power rifle caliber rounds ARE allowed on Ranges 2 and 8, **PISTOL CALIBER AND BLACK POWDER ONLY ON 4A.**

HIGH POWER RIFLES:

RANGES 2 and 8: Firing allowed sitting at bench only.

RANGE 3: Firing allowed standing, sitting, prone and sitting at bench.

PISTOL CALIBER AND BLACK POWDER RIFLES AND CARBINES:

includes .17 and .22 Rimfire, .38, .44 and .45 but not .223, .556, 7.62x39, 30-30, 308, etc. RANGES 2, 3, 4A, 4B, 5, 8, and 7 including 25/50yard Bullseye line.

SHOTGUNS:


RANGE 6: Use clay pigeon targets and birdshot ammunition with #6 through #9 shot. Slugs, buckshot and #4 shot not allowed. **NO RIFLES OR HANDGUNS ALLOWED.**

RANGES 5 and 7: Use with paper targets, clay pigeon targets not allowed.

ARCHERY: RANGES 5 and 7

Range 1: 7- and 15-yard pistol range, Day members allowed

Range 2: 100-yard line primarily for rifles, Day members allowed

Range 3: 200-yard line primarily for rifles

Range 4A: 100-yard line primarily for rifles, pistol calibers and black powder only

Range 4B: Silhouette range, pistol calibers and black powder only

Range 5: General purpose bays, pistol calibers, black powder and shotgun only

Range 6: Shotgun with birdshot only, no pistols, black powder or rifles

Range 7: General purpose bays, pistol calibers, black powder and shot gun only

NOTE: FIRING OF "HIGH POWER" RIFLE AMMO LIKE AR/AK .223, 5.56 OR 7.62x39, etc. ON THE 4B SILHOUETTE RANGE, OR RANGES 5, 6 AND 7 WILL LIKELY RESULT IN LOSS OF MEMBERSHIP

Range 4A: Same as Range 3 except 100-yards only


Range 4B: Rifles in rim fire .22 cal, .17 cal plus black powder rifles
