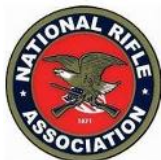

## Have you heard of the Concealed Pistol Home Defense Shotgun Match

On the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of every month, on range 5, a group of shooters gather to toss lead down range in light competition. We call it the Concealed Pistol Home Defense Shotgun Match or just Home Defense for short. It is a pistol-shotgun match, but shooters have the option to include a pistol caliber carbine (PCC) to make it a 3 gun competition.

Back in 2017 a group of cowboys out of Fort White hit on the idea of shooting modern guns but using the cowboy's steel targets. They called it EDC, Everyday Carry. Our local cowboys, Cowford Regulators, liked the idea and they brought the match to GRPC. The rules

and regulations did not fully transfer to Gateway, so some modification took place, including a name change to Concealed Pistol Home Defense Shotgun Match or CPHDSM. You may have seen this abbreviation on the range calendar and not given it a thought.

We shoot virtually everything from .22 to .45 and have categories to accommodate whatever guns you bring. There are two caveats. 1. Because the cowboy targets are used, no jacketed ammo is allowed. We shoot lead, Federal Syntech or powder coated lead. It used to be harder to find lead 9mm, but North Florida Ammo in Orange Park has all the ammo we shoot. Of course, some shooters load their own. 2. Because we often move with the shotgun, no semi-auto shotguns are used. Break action or pumps work well for us. We use bird shot (#4 to #9) in any shotgun bore.

Semi-Auto with Pump (SP) and Semi-Auto with Pump & carbine (SPC) are the most popular categories.

However, many shoot revolvers (double action only). We even have categories where the shooter can use a pistol not only for pistol targets but also in place of the carbine. You might want to shoot Josey Wales, 4 revolvers and a break shotgun.

## Reloading

Whether you're an experienced reloader or just getting started, you'll quickly discover that there are many types of presses on the market—and just as many opinions about which one is “best.” This article isn't meant to dive into every detail of how presses operate, but rather to provide a general overview of what's available and what

---

many of us consider when choosing reloading equipment.

If you're a beginner, start by asking yourself what you plan to reload—pistol, rifle, or shotgun—and how much you expect to produce each week. For simplicity, this discussion focuses on commonly used, consumer-level presses. High-end commercial equipment and shotgun reloading can be saved for another time.

Whether you favor Lee, Hornady, RCBS, Dillon, or another brand, the truth is that they all make quality presses. Choosing the “best” one often comes down to personal preference and what feels right to you.

Reloading requires more than just a press. You'll use dies, components, cleaning tools, reference materials, and some form of record keeping. Just like presses, dies come in different brands, and it's perfectly acceptable to use brand “A” dies in brand “B” presses. Dies shape the case or seat the bullet, and they're made for specific cartridges in either steel or carbide, depending on whether the case is bottlenecked or straight-walled.

Reloading presses themselves come in several configurations, but the two most common types are single-stage and progressive presses. A single-stage press performs one operation with each pull of the handle, making it slower but easier for beginners to learn each step. A progressive press performs several operations at once, greatly increasing production speed, but requiring more attention since multiple things happen simultaneously.

I learned on a single-stage RCBS Rock Chucker that I inherited from my uncle, and I'm grateful for that experience because it taught me the feel of each step in the process. Later, I added a Dillon XL650 progressive press for higher-volume work, but I still use the Rock Chucker for precision tasks—and now I own two of them.

This has been a brief overview of reloading presses and some of the components involved. There are many steps in the reloading process, and I can't emphasize enough the importance of research. Read books, watch instructional videos, talk to experienced reloaders, and—if you can—observe someone reloading in person. The more you learn, the better and safer your results will be.

Upon arrival, there was a brother Officer, weapon still in hand, and a "suspect" on the floor with 2 perfect shots into the K-5 area!! Job well done we all thought ??!?! until we all looked a little closer at the "suspect"...a mannequin! In the heat of the moment, this brother Officer came around a corner and suddenly observed a "suspect lunging out towards him". He reacted as trained and fired his weapon in self-defense. As I mentioned above, this was in the middle of summertime. This mannequin was part of a display for summer and was placed in an upright position with arms raised as if jumping. In the heat of the moment, this brother, in his mind, observed what we thought was a suspect jumping to attack him which is why he fired in self-defense. Thankfully, all Officers were unharmed, but the "suspect" needed some "plastic surgery"! We understand that this mannequin later was able to return to work but was now asking for additional "Hazardous Duty Pay"!

# Where To Shoot What at Gateway

## DAY MEMBERS and ANNUAL / LIFE MEMBERS: RANGES 1 & 2

**RANGE 1, PISTOLS and REVOLVERS:** Located to far left as you exit the club store.

**No rifles or shotguns allowed**

**NO FIRING OF HIGH POWER RIFLE ROUNDS (i.e. 223, 556, 7.62x39, 308, etc.) ALLOWED ON RANGE 1**

**RANGE 2, as follows:** Located slightly left as you exit the club store.

### **BENCH SHOOTING ONLY**

**RIFLES, CARBINES, AR and AK style pistols with arm brace:** All positions except 27 & 28: All calibers including rimfires, pistol calibers, high power/centerfire calibers, and black powder. AR and AK pistols must be fired supported from bench.

### **SHOTGUNS with shoulder stocks:**

Positions 1-26: For shotguns with iron sights or optics, i.e. not a "bead" only front sight and must shoot slugs or turkey loads  
Position 27: This position is for "patterning" birdshot loads. Ammunition must be #6 through #9 shot.

Position 28: This position is for function checking. Ammunition must be #6 through #9 shot.

### **SHOTGUNS without shoulder stocks:**

Position 28 only: This position is for function checking. Ammunition must be #6 through #9 shot.

## ANNUAL AND LIFE MEMBERS ONLY: RANGES 3-8

### **PISTOLS AND REVOLVERS:**

RANGES 5 and 7 including the 25/50-yard Bullseye range: Pistol caliber ammunition only.

**NO FIRING OF HIGH POWER RIFLE ROUNDS (i.e. 223, 556, 7.62x39, 308, etc.) ALLOWED ON RANGES 5 and 7.**

RANGE 4B: Barrels must be 2-inch minimum length. Pistol caliber ammunition only.

**NO FIRING OF HIGH POWER RIFLE ROUNDS (i.e. 223, 556, 7.62x39, 308, etc.) ALLOWED ON RANGE 4B.**

RANGE 4A: Barrels must be 10-inch minimum length.  
**HIGH POWER RIFLE CALIBER ROUNDS ARE NOT ALLOWED.**

RANGE 3: Must be capable of accurate fire at 200-yards.  
**High power rifle caliber rounds ARE allowed.**

### **AR15 AND AK47 STYLE PISTOLS WITH ARM BRACE:**

RANGES 2, 4A, and 8: Must be supported/aimed fire from bench. High power rifle caliber rounds ARE allowed on Ranges 2 and 8,  
**PISTOL CALIBER AND BLACK POWDER ONLY ON 4A.**

### **HIGH POWER RIFLES:**

RANGES 2 and 8: Firing allowed sitting at bench only.

RANGE 3: Firing allowed standing, sitting, prone and sitting at bench.

### **PISTOL CALIBER AND BLACK POWDER RIFLES AND CARBINES:**

includes .17 and .22 Rimfire, .38, .44 and .45 but not .223, .556, 7.62x39, 30-30, 308, etc.  
RANGES 2, 3, 4A, 4B, 5, 8, and 7 including 25/50-yard Bullseye line.

### **SHOTGUNS:**

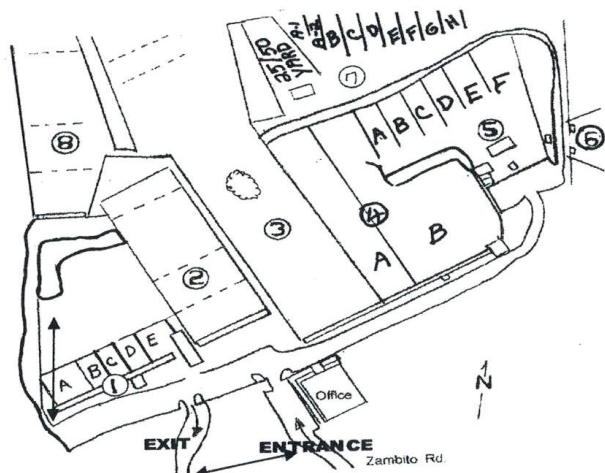
RANGE 6: Use clay pigeon targets and birdshot ammunition with #6 through #9 shot. Slugs, buckshot and #4 shot not allowed. **NO RIFLES OR HANDGUNS ALLOWED.**

RANGES 5 and 7: Use with paper targets, clay pigeon targets not allowed.

### **ARCHERY: RANGES 5 and 7**

### Range Details:

**Range 1:** 7- and 15-yard pistol range, **Day members allowed**

**Range 2:** 100-yard line primarily for rifles, **Day members allowed**

**Range 3:** 200-yard line primarily for rifles

**Range 4A:** 100-yard line primarily for rifles, **pistol calibers and black powder only**

**Range 4B:** Silhouette range, **pistol calibers and black powder only**

**Range 5:** General purpose bays, **pistol calibers, black powder and shotgun only**

**Range 6:** Shotgun with birdshot only, **no pistols, black powder or rifles**

**Range 7:** General purpose bays, **pistol calibers, black powder and shot gun only**

**NOTE: FIRING OF "HIGH POWER" RIFLE AMMO LIKE AR/AK .223, 5.56 OR 7.62x39, etc. ON THE 4B SILHOUETTE RANGE, OR RANGES 5, 6 AND 7 WILL LIKELY RESULT IN LOSS OF MEMBERSHIP**

Ranges 1 A-B-C-D: Pistols only with pistol calibers. Location: Far left (West) as you leave front office, 53 positions at 7/15 yards

Range 2: Rifles at 25-50 and 100 yards and shotguns on select positions

### Annual and Life Members Only

Both of above two ranges, #1 and #2

Range 3: Rifle 50- and 200-yards and Pistols with 10 inch Barrels or longer chambered for rifle cartridges

Range 4A: Same as Range 3 except 100-yards only

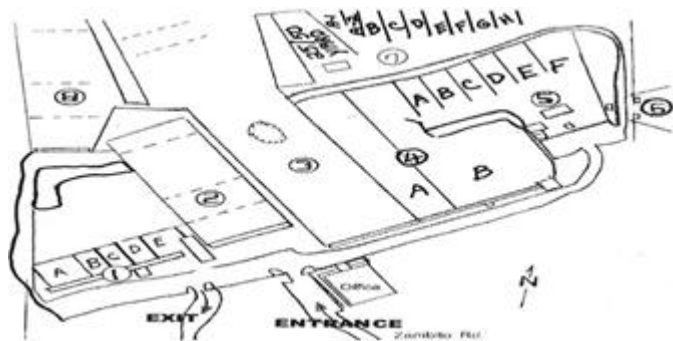
Range 4B: Rifles in rim fire .22 cal, .17 cal plus black powder rifles

Range 5 A-B-C-D-E-F: All-purpose ranges for Pistols and Rifles with Pistol Calibers
